Chaplain's Message.....

Dear Knights:

The Bible is Catholic

Catholics are called to read the bible. Each week at mass we hear from the Old Testament, Psalms, New Testament, and the Gospels. The mass enters us into the mystery of God's love for us. In the Liturgy of the Word, we hear from every book in the



bible in a three-year cycle. We not only hear the Word of God proclaimed each week at Mass, but we also are encouraged to read the bible on our own and with our families. It would be wonderful for each family of the parish to have an evening dedicated to reading the bible. An evening when we read a passage or a few chapters of a book of the bible. It would be helpful to have a good catholic commentary on the book, to understand the context. Parents could read the commentary beforehand and explain to their children the context of the book of the bible they are going to read from each week. I invite your family to pray about having an evening with the bible each week. The Gospels are a good place to start reading, or maybe you read the following Sunday's readings for Mass. They can be easily accessed online or through any number of subscriptions. The important part is to start reading the Bible within the family or on your own.

The United States Catholic Bishops Conference (USCCB) gives ten insights on Catholics reading the bible. I list five here, because of space. Please find the full list at:

1. **Bible reading is for Catholics.** The Church encourages Catholics to make reading the Bible part of their daily prayer lives. Reading these inspired words, people grow deeper in their relationship with God and come to understand their place in the community God has called them to in himself.

2. **Prayer is the beginning and the end.** Reading the Bible is not like reading a novel or a history book. It should begin with a prayer asking the Holy Spirit to open our hearts and minds to the Word of God. Scripture reading should end with a prayer that this Word will bear fruit in our lives, helping us to become holier and more faithful people.

3. Get the whole story! When selecting a Bible, look for a Catholic edition. A Catholic edition will include the Church's complete list of sacred books along with introductions and notes for understanding the text. A Catholic edition will have an *imprimatur* notice on the back of the title page. An *imprimatur* indicates that the book is free of errors in Catholic doctrine.

4. **The Bible isn't a book. It's a library.** The Bible is a collection of 73 books written over the course of many centuries. The books include royal history, prophecy, poetry, challenging letters to struggling new faith communities, and believers' accounts of the preaching and passion of Jesus. Knowing the genre of the book you are reading will help you understand the literary tools the author is using and the meaning the author is trying to convey.

We were welcomed by the staff at the Vincentian Continuing Care facility on September 22nd, where we helped serve lunch to 17 residents (including 3 priests) at the retirement complex. September was also the month where we supported the March for Life in Harrisburg. Our Living Rosary at Saints John and Paul's outdoor Rosary Garden had 21 attendees (including 9 Knights), family members, and friends. Thanks to Wally Merriman for his musical entertainment at the Pizza Party following the Rosary. Many of our Knights helped give away Tootsie Rolls (and accepting donations) at Regina Coeli Parish's St. John Neumann Church on Sept. 24th & 25th (St. Aidan's is Oct. 1st & 2nd). With all this going on, and the many sub-committee meetings not mentioned here, it's no wonder things have gone by so fast.

As you know, with the recent changes in federal laws, abortion is no longer "by-request" in all states. There is a possibility that more parents and their infants will need the help of the KofC. Our National leadership has started a new program to address this need: The "Aid Support After Pregnancy Program (ASAP) and <www.kofc.org/ASAP>. We have adopted this program within our Council by forming a committee to develop a "local approach" which we can take to our Parishes, for their participation. Several committee meetings have been held and programs to address prebirth and post-birth needs are being discussed. You will hear about these programs soon, in future Olive Branch Articles, and from the pulpit of your churches. Anyone interested in helping us provide help to pre-born and newly-born babies, and their parents, please contact me. Any ideas or help would be welcome.

Every September a non-profit organization known as *Life Happens* coordinates the Life Insurance Awareness Month campaign. This campaign is dedicated to informing people about

Message from SSJP Karen Walker: Thanks for this/your emails. I wanted to make a correction – Saints John & Paul has (actually) Re-established Perpetual Adoration in our Grotto Chapel. Adoration is available (24) hours/ (6) days a week – Sunday through Friday. There is No-adoration on Saturdays, so that Weddings and Baptisms can take place, as well as permitting time for the Grotto to be cleaned. We appreciate the help of the KofC to commit to Eucharistic Adoration. While all the spots are filled, it's better to have 2-Adorers (in case of last-minute emergencies or when there is a need of a sub). I'll add that we no-longer require those engaging in adoration to Wear-Masks. We are following the diocesan COVID Protocol, which States that Masks are recommended when individuals gather indoors, but they are not-required.
